

We are in the season of Lent. Maybe we have given up something. Maybe we have added extra prayers. Maybe we are doing random acts of kindness. Whatever we are doing, it is important. This is a time not only to give things up, but to add. We die to ourselves in the hope of becoming more like Jesus in our everyday walk.

When I arrived here, I was a bit overwhelmed by the size of our property. It is absolutely stunning. The sun shining through the stained glass windows, the beautiful acoustics, the sense of the Holy One in our midst. More importantly, I found a people hungry for God. Hungry for meaning in their lives. Yes, it is difficult not being able to worship in this holy space. However, I feel that during this time we have realized just how much more we are a church through the people of God, not just a building.
