







Ally Challenge is Monday, August 23 - Sunday, August 29, 2021

Parking Volunteers will be needed...

Summer is flying by faster than any of us would wish and before we know it, golfers, caddies, TV cameras and crowds will descend upon Warwick Hills and St. Christopher's for the Ally Challenge! We are very fortunate to have this annual opportunity to raise funds through our partnership with the Tournament-many of us can recall what a blow it was when the Buick Open left our community.



St. Christopher's provides parking for the caddies, media, VIPS (whoever THEY are!) and the tournament volunteers, using our front lawn, parking lot and back field. Volunteers are needed in several roles during the week. The weekend before the the Challenge begins, volunteers "stripe" the grass to define traffic lanes and parking spaces. Monday and Tuesday are lighter work days as the golfers and caddies arrive to walk the course, get in some practice rounds and field interviews with local media. Wednesday and Thursday, we start getting busier as golf begins with the ProAm rounds which provide funds to many area charities. Play begins in earnest on Friday morning with the start of the 3 round tournament and concludes Sunday afternoon with the trophy presentation to this year's Ally Champion. Clean up and sign removal is a job easily accomplished in an hour or less on Monday the 30th after the Tournament.

It takes many hands to make it through the week and we do have a lot of fun with our guests and each other. The work is not difficult, we greet our guests and direct them to appropriate areas. We are sometimes called upon to give directions, suggest good restaurants or "watering holes". But, mostly, we smile and welcome everyone. We NEVER drive or park anyone's car, so bad driving is not an excuse!

Following tournament play on Saturday, there is a concert held near the practice putting greens. This years entertainment will be provided by Little Big Town. We will be offering paid public parking for the concert and expect to be very crowded-lots of hands will be needed Saturday afternoon to take money and guide concert-goers to safe parking spaces. Once the concert starts, we usually gather with our lawn chairs outside the columbarium chapel for a good view of the concert and to enjoy a pizza party!

In years past, we have moved our Sunday morning worship to an evening service. I have had a conversation with Fr. Jerry about this. He will decide and announce what our service schedule will be for August 29th.

The four day event includes daytime sessions with panel discussions, prayer, and fellowship, as well as evening worship and preaching inspired by the hymn, Lift Every Voice and Sing.

 We will begin with prayer and then move into a time to sit, chat, and have a cup of coffee!


