# FROM THE PRIEST'S DESK

Recently, I planted some annuals in my front flower garden at home. I do love my flowers! If you are on Facebook, check out the pictures. However, getting the job done was no easy task. Getting up and down made me realize just how out of shape I am! I've gotten older and heavier, and I don't exercise nearly enough. We all know that the more we exercise, the better we feel.

So it is with our faith. The more we exercise it, the better it gets. In terms of our faith, we tend to think of going to church and saying our prayers. This encapsulates what, for too many, faith has become. Our churches are empty. What does that say about where we are? We have to exercise (our faith) much more than we do. We must expand our notion of what it means to be a follower of Jesus, moving from simply praying and going to church once a week, to being an active follower of Jesus. The world needs us. The world needs us to be the love of God. The world has plenty of hatred and violence.

Our faith is to be active. We are called by our baptism to live our faith in our daily actions. To gather as community (not just on Sunday) to worship, to

be fed physically and spiritually. If we never put our faith into action, if we always depend on others to "do God's work" then we are not living out our baptismal covenant, our promise to God. Our covenant with God is binding. Our covenant to "seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself" (BCP 305). Our covenant to "strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being (BCP 305). God has never abandoned us. Yet, over and over, believers have turned away from God. It is time for us to repent of our inaction. It is time to repent of our apathy. It is time to live out our faith. God needs us. The world needs us. We need one another. Together, we can and must, make the Kingdom of God a reality here on earth. It is time. We need to be able to say "We promise to welcome you in Christ's name. We will honor the gifts you bring. We will invite you into our community or wish you well if you choose another path." (Dorothy Isabell Crocker, p. 44, 101 Reasons to be an Episcopalian.)
