A Free-Will donation will be collected at the concert, all of which goes to St. Christopher's. The concert will be performed by the local Rock of Ages Big Band, which played its first concert in December of 2004 at the First Baptist Church in Davison. The band has played continually in the mid-Michigan area since that time, except during the Covid-19 lockdown. In September of 2021, the post-lockdown band reunited with vigor and played some six Christmas concerts in the area, featuring both secular and



sacred music. The upcoming concert will draw from music played by: Glenn Miller; Count Basie; Duke Ellington; Dean Martin, Frank Sinatra; Nat & Natalie Cole; The Beatles, Earth, Wind and Fire; Ray Charles; Stevie Wonder; Michael Jackson; and others. A reception will follow the concert in the Parish Hall. St. Christopher's member, Ken Duck, has played various saxophones and clarinet with the Rock of Ages Big Band since 2019.


A Prayer for Vestry:
