notes from the... Music Room



Greetings Music Lovers of St. Christopher's!

Happy 2023! We have a wonderful year ahead and I plan to make the most of the talent we have in our church (one of our greatest resources!) Folks will notice that the bulletin going forward will not include music selections. Please, despite our no longer having this convenience provided us, just grab the blue hymnal, and be ready to sing your hearts out! The interesting part of our getting to use the hymnals for now, is you will be able to learn many interesting details about the hymns we will be singing---just to remind us, myself included, a 'hymn' is, the whole point of it is, A SONG OF PRAISE.

Now, back to deciphering the information on the page in our hymnals---i.e., the name of the composer, the person responsible for the particular text we will be singing, the person credited with the music---everything is provided us on each page. For example...did you happen to know that at the bottom of a given page, where it might read:

Music: Durham, melody and Brass Thomas Ravenscroft (1592-1635), the information it is providing us actually is saying the following:

Composer: Thomas Ravenscroft

Thomas Ravenscroft United Kingdom 1592-1635. Born at Sussex, England, he allegedly sang in the choir at St Paul's Cathedral. He attended music lectures at Gresham College. He was educated at Cambridge College, graduating in 1607. From 1618-1622 he was music master at Christ's Hospital. Many of his works were aimed at pleasing a middle class lay public. He collected folk music: "Pammelia" (1609), "Deuteromelia" [includes the song "Three blind mice"] (1609), "Melismata" (1611). He also published a metrical Psalter (the whole book of Psalms) in 1621. He composed 11 anthems, three motets, and four fantasies. He also wrote two treatises on music theory.

Something else you may notice on a page are numbers, waaaay down at the bottom right of a given page in the hymnal. You might think to yourself, 'what the heck does that mean'? Well, if you happen to wonder this, I can provide you an answer! Yay! These numbers indicate the syllables in a phrase---Hymn meters. The meter indicates the number of syllables for the lines in each stanza of a hymn. This provides a means of marrying the hymn's text with an appropriate hymn tune for singing. In practice many hymns conform to one of a relatively small number of meters (syllable count and stress patterns). The meter is often denoted by a row of figures besides the name of the tune, such as "87.87.87", which would inform the reader that each verse has six lines, and that the first line has eight syllables, the second has seven, the third line eight, etc. The meter can also be described by initials; L.M. indicates long meter, which is 88.88 (four lines, each eight syllables long); S.M. is short meter (66.86); C.M. is common metre (86.86), while D.L.M., D.S.M. and D.C.M. (the "D" stands for double) are similar to their respective single meters except that they have eight lines in a verse instead of four. Also, if the number of syllables in one verse differ from another verse in the same hymn (e.g., the hymn "I Sing a Song of the Saints of God"), the meter is called Irregular.

Inquiring minds want to know!!!

Also, if it says something like, Chelsea Square, or Detroit, or Geneva, these particular 'tunes' were known as such (often credited to having been composed in this area/region/town) and then called out, for the melody to then be used with a text intended for the hymn. The practice of naming hymn tunes developed to help identify a particular tune. The name was chosen by the compiler of the tune book or hymnal or by the composer. The majority of names have a connection with the composer and many are place names, such as Aberystwyth or Down Ampney.

Okay, gentle readers, this is just a little bit of information which I thought might be of interest as we begin our foray into our hymnals!
