## The Hiding Place - August 3rd - A Global Cinema Event

During World War II righteous Gentiles risked their lives providing havens for endangered Jews. The Hilding Place, written by Corrie Ten Boom tells of her family's heroic work in safeguarding Jews in the Dutch town of Haarlem. Papa Ten Boom, a watchmaker, and his daughter Betsie and Corrie opened their door to all in need, saving approximately 800 Jews. The family was betrayed; Papa Ten Boom and Betsie died as a result. Corrie was released from a concentration camp through a clerical error. After the war, she became a "tramp for the Lord" traveling the world with her message of forgiveness, hope, love and salvation. Her books and the 1975 film version of The Hiding Place are Christian classics. An all new film version of *The Hiding Place* makes its world premiere on August 3-5. Trillium Theater in Grand Blanc is one of the participating theaters.
