SENIOR WARDEN REPORT...

We have spoken a lot over the past year about transparency. It is a path that led us successfully through the Principal Payoff Challenge and can serve us well in the future. To that end, it is important to know that the Vestry is working actively to control and reduce our monthly costs, as well as implementing some long deferred maintenance to our building. We have contracted with Boss Lawn Services for our snow removal and mowing, resulting in savings of several thousand dollars per year. A conversation with Waste Management Services decreased our visits from them from every 2 weeks to once monthly (which, so far, has proven adequate) and lowered our cost by over \$600 per month. On Monday, Goyette Mechanical will be on site to improve the parking lot lighting. Once that task is completed, they will bring their lift into the Nave to help us determine whether the light bulbs can be replaced or if we must begin exploring alternatives to the current fixtures. If you have other suggestions for cost cutting, please share them with a Vestry member!

For the past few years, Grand Blanc High School has held Adopt a Senior. This was done in response to the loss of graduation related activities during covid. This year, Fr. Jerry and I thought St. Chris should be a part. We have adopted Angela Zinsli's oldest son Elijah. If you would like to join in creating a graduation gift basket, a donation of a snack food, gift cards, gas cards, candy, graduation greeting cards, (the ever popular) cash would help us bring a smile-it's been a rough year for the Zinsli family. See any Vestry member to contribute.

August 19-25 will see the PGA Champions' Tour return to Warwick for the Ally Challenge. We will again be under contract with Ally to provide parking for caddies, media, VIPs, etc. The Saturday concert will headline Thomas Wright, the artist for Friday night has not been released at this time. Last year raised over \$29,000. In planning this year's budget, Ally was not factored in, but will serve as a source for some needed "home improvement" work. Please keep some time open to help with parking during the tournament.

As you may have read in the Cyber Trumpeter, Church School and Bible Study will begin soon, the Chosen will resume at a date to be announced(as the DVDs become available). Fr. Jerry and the Vestry have heard and are acting upon your desire for religious education and encourage you to partake in any or all of the classes!

Plans are in the works for our Mortgage Burning Celebration. Stay tuned as details are released.

If you haven't had an opportunity to see the forsythia bushes outside the baptistry windows, please take a look. They have had a MAJOR trimming and are in full bloom. Thank you to whomever did the trimming! They are gorgeous and the tulips in the garden are beautiful!

We've survived the April showers-mostly in our winter coats. Let's pray for more of those May flowers, warm temperatures and sunny weather in the days ahead.
